

## Topic Proposal

**Due:** 10/10 to Blackboard by end of day

Professionals and scholars write to superiors to propose projects. For this low-stakes assignment, you will write with the purpose of persuading your instructor that you have identified a viable research question this semester.

Your topic must fall under the broad category of pop culture. This includes, but is not limited to, social media, television shows, movies, books, fashion, and YouTube. A successful research question will be:

- **clear:** it provides enough specifics that one's audience can easily understand its purpose without needing additional explanation.
- **focused:** it is narrow enough that it can be answered thoroughly in the space the writing task allows.
- **concise:** it is expressed in the fewest possible words.
- **complex:** it is not answerable with a simple "yes" or "no," but rather requires synthesis and analysis of ideas and sources prior to composition of an answer.
- **arguable:** its potential answers are open to debate rather than accepted facts.

You will be researching and writing on this topic for the remainder of the semester, so be sure to pick something that interests you!

### **Format:**

For this proposal, you will write 1-2 paragraphs. You will begin by stating your proposed topic, your research question and its significance. Provide any background information necessary for understanding your question. You will then explain why this topic is of interest to you, and finally end with a request for approval.

### **Grading:**
